



Harrisburg City Council Minutes November 9, 2016

The Harrisburg City Council met on this date at City Hall, located at 120 Smith St., at the hour of 6:30pm. Presiding was Mayor Robert Duncan. Also present were as follows:

Concerned Citizens in the Audience:

- Kay Barnett, 1052 Whitledge Place, said thank you to the Mayor and Councilors for all their hard work, and congratulated them on the election, in which all were re-elected to their current positions.
- Lee Heckart, 1025 Heckart Lane, wanted to let Council know that they had received their latest water and sewer bill, which was \$74.74. He questioned why with only two individuals in their household, they should have a bill that is as much as what a family of four pays. (His sewer alone was \$71.20, and storm was \$3.54). He said that the family of 4 has a bill that is \$73.85. Another family had a bill with 2 adults, and the sewer portion was \$47.49, while the total bill was \$87.44. Harrisburg charges a presumed water usage of 2.81 EUU's per household resident that is at least six years old. How does the council justify charging 5 units per individual, which is double that of the average user?
- Latta said that for sewer only accounts, when Harrisburg wrote the ordinance, they decided to establish a specific EUU (Equivalent User Unit) for that. [Recorders note: A EUU is equal to 748 gallons of metered water]. That's because we can't determine how much water usage there is without a meter on the well. We can read the meter on the well, which gives us an accurate reading, or we can charge 5 units per individual in the house. He talked with Mr. Heckart about this, and told him the best solution was to put a meter on the well. He did say that he wanted to come to Council tonight in order to point

out what the ordinance states. Some households use more and some less. In Heckart's household, for only two individuals, their water use should be less. It does seem unfair, but that is how the ordinance is applied.

- Downey asked when the ordinance was written.
- Latta said that it's fairly old. However, we are already working on re-writing the ordinance, which we expect to update in the next year.
- Heckart said that when they built the house, they were prepared to hook up to the water lines. However, the former City Administrator, Dan Eckles, said that water wasn't available to them, and in fact, he didn't know when it would ever be available. So they put in a well, at a substantial cost, and have used it ever since. He was serving on Council when a housing development was put in to the south of his property. They asked to put in a sewer line across his land, and he didn't charge them a dime for that. They tore up the property fairly well. Bruce Cleeton told him that he needed to install a meter to the well, but Heckart told him that sure, he could do that, if the City paid for his well.

Scholz said that you can install a sewer meter; but those are much more expensive than water meters. Latta thought that Heckart had purchased a meter at one point, but Heckart said that he had purchased the shell for one. He was going to irrigate with the well water. Mayor Duncan asked how deep the well was, and Heckart told him 40 feet. The well driller put in 4 wells, for each of them in his family. All of them are 40' deep. Boese asked why he didn't want to put in a water meter to the well now. Heckart told him it was cost. If they add a meter, then they have to install a backflow device too. That would be above ground, so then you would need to insulate it. Right now, they are grandfathered in for adding water to the house, once a line becomes available. If he died, or if the property were to sell, then someone else coming in would have a year to install water. His neighbor purchased the house near him, and had to add water because of that ordinance.

Bob Bronson, 865 Sommerville Loop, said that they have a similar situation, and a sewer only account. They have a good aquifer; theirs is a little deeper than Heckart's is. Bronson added that when he went to bed, the fire bond was behind by 5 votes, and now we have 60 votes ahead. We have a lot to do coming up; he will be by to talk with Brian. Mayor Duncan asked when they will know the exact numbers. Latta knew that they were done counting ballots; so the numbers shouldn't change that much. Eldridge added that the counties have 20 days in which to provide the abstract following an election. Bronson said that they will start putting together stuff soon, after they are certified. He returned to the water/well issue; he doesn't have a problem paying for the service, but how it's done could be looked at. Maybe they could look at doing a joint purchase in order to reduce some of the cost. It's pretty good for the City, because they get paid revenue, but don't have to furnish the water.

A Discussion with the Linn County Sheriff's Office

Sergeants Report: Sergeant Greg Klein went over the results of the October Sheriff Offices' report. (Please see Addendum No. 1) They had 513 hours spent in Harrisburg, 31 of those

related to traffic hours. They had 25 citations, and 22 warnings, along with 2 crashes. He had brought one of their deputies, Deputy Steve Frambes. He is a patrol officer.

- Deputy Frambes said that there is a lot of drug traffic in the bigger cities, and therefore, in-between cities with drug deliveries. They don't like using I-5, and like to take the back roads, like Hwy 99. He described stopping a person who was going so fast in Harrisburg that they passed someone on the curve coming out of the bridge into Harrisburg. It was a simple violation, but she couldn't provide id. She gave a variety of names, and he wasn't able to identify her through those. He therefore had to search the car, and found bags of meth, and heroin. They came from Eugene, going to Salem, and were taking back roads. So don't take it wrong when we check on small things, like a light off, following too closely, or failing to use your blinker. That's a safety issue, but at the same time, they do that because they can also check for criminal activity. They typically provide warnings to citizens who are honest, and have all the id and registration on them for that reason.
- Sergeant Klein said that their team all provided citations in the month of October, including Captain Guilford, and Lieutenant Duncan.
- Deputy Frambes said that there seems to be more kids walking to school this year, and traffic gets pretty heavy at times, especially at lunch. That's a good time to be watching traffic.
- Downey said that our measure for prohibiting marijuana facilities passed, which she was quite pleased about. Every quarter they hold a crime prevention forum. The next one will be held on November 30th, at 6:30, at the Harrisburg Christian Church. The main topic is fraud. That's whether it's computer fraud, internet fraud, or money fraud. It will be put on the calendar in the website.

The Matter of Approving the Consent List for November 9, 2016

- Downey **motioned to approve the Consent List in the Council Packet. She was seconded** by Caughey, and the **City Council voted unanimously to approve the Consent List for November 9, 2016. Approving the Council packet approved the following actions:**

The matter of Discussing the Fence Issue at Priceboro Park and Abutting Properties

Staff Report: Latta remarked that this is a continuing issue. It started in 2012, when it was discovered that property owners had fences located on City property. The Council made a decision to give the property owners a bit of time to move the fences. He learned about this in 2014, so he came to the Government Committee, and Council. One of the properties had sold, but the new owner didn't know about the requirement, because it had foreclosed, and a title search showed a clean title. He was instructed to do deed restrictions, and to touch base with the property owners. In those conversations with property owners, he started coming up with another probable solution that made more sense. Most of the property owners had made improvements to the land, and at least 3 of the properties had mature landscaping, and specifically, some nice trees, and shrubs along the fence line in this area. He didn't think we

needed to push as hard to get this done in 2017, particularly in light of what the City is doing with the land. The land in question is to the west of storm water detention pond; it's really no-man's land right now. We tried to come up with some solutions; one of which was to sell them the land. However, the state statutes are very strict with selling public land. You have to do a public hearing and notices, which means that the home owners might very well be in a bidding war for that property. We didn't want that. You can also enter into a long term lease agreement. By state statute, we can enter into a long term lease for a maximum of 60 years, with a private citizen. That's what we are proposing. Latta can write a lease agreement, in a case by case manner. Within 60 years, it's likely the fence will need replacing, which could trigger the fence moving. Right now, it's really not conducive to making them move the fence, and lose or move their landscaping. He has talked with and come to an agreement with three of the property owners; the fourth hasn't committed. The City is not looking to charge them, although we would have to charge them something for the consideration of the lease; perhaps \$1 for 60 years, or something like that. There's also a recording fee involved, but the City can pay that.

Puls asked if we could do a property line adjustment. Latta wasn't sure if we could do one or not, but it might be a solution. Debbie Magnuson, of 1099 S. 11th, said that her property would also probably require an adjustment of the sidewalk. (Her home is located north of the sidewalk that cuts through to Priceboro Park from 11th.) Latta said that they are right next to the area that has the pump station. Magnuson said that they just purchased the property in July. Puls said again, that she thought a permanent lot line adjustment would solve this, and both Boese and Caughey liked that solution as well. Bob Bronson, in the audience, said that they had done that at the County too (Bronson is a member of the Linn County Planning Commission.) Latta said that he would need to talk to the City Attorney, to make sure that we wouldn't have problems handing it that way.

Magnuson said that the City, and Tim Bunnell, had signed off on the fence. The previous owners, when we went to them, said hey, the City signed off on the permit, so it has to be right. Latta said that the city did issue a fence permit; however, it's the homeowner's responsibility to verify their property lines. We make very sure when we issue these, that we tell you that you are responsible for doing this. We approve them based on the fact that what you have given us is accurate. Mayor Duncan thought we could either do the 60 year lease, or check into a lot line adjustment. Magnuson asked if we did a lot line adjustment, is that something that would show up in a title search. Latta told her yes. Those are recorded at the county, so it's not a surprise in the future to another homeowner.

Latta said that he will check into those solutions. Just so the homeowners knew, he would be sending them a letter to follow up with them, stating the results of the meeting, and what he was considering doing. He told the City Council that if we can do a lot line adjustment, then he would come back to City Council in December. He anticipates that we would need a motion to sell, lease, or give the property to the owners. Magnuson said that she just wanted them to know, that her kids went to Harrisburg, and the Wyatt school...she was a local. She wanted them to know that Brian was a pleasure to work with. Right now, this is the only home she's purchased in Harrisburg, and Latta made it very easy. He helped her to contact the other home owners.

The matter of a Request for a Liquor License for American Market

Staff Report: Eldridge noted that this is a general liquor license request for the convenience part of the market there. One of the new owners of the American Market was here tonight to meet Council. His name is Mohit Singla.

Council thanked him for coming. Downey asked if they had other businesses; Singla told her yes, they had some they were trying to purchase in Albany. They work out of Eugene, he and his partner. They were really glad to be here; they are originally from New Delhi, India, and they had been here for about ten years now. He related some other personal information about his family as well. Eldridge said that the Council could now modify the motion, because we had received payment from Singla and Agarwal, for the liquor license, the transfer license, and the license for 2017. She noted that the liquor license for the liquor store is a separate issue. Singla added that they had decided to let the current owners sub-let the liquor store, rather than trying to do otherwise. Latta told them that since the old owners are sub-leasing the liquor store from the new owners, then they will need to have a business license for that.

- **Caughey motioned that the City Council take no action in opposition to the issuance of a liquor license for American Market, and to authorize City Staff to sign the liquor license. He was seconded by Downey, and the City Council voted unanimously to approve the issuance of an off-premise liquor license for American Market.**

The matter of a Request for a Liquor License for Dollar General Store #17223.

Staff Report: Eldridge said that this was the same type of license as that for American Market. It would allow the Dollar General to sell beer, wine, and hard cider.

- **Downey motioned that the City Council take no action in opposition to the issuance of a liquor license for the Dollar General Store, and to authorize City Staff to sign the liquor license. She was seconded by Caughey, and the City Council vote unanimously to issue the Off-Premise liquor license for the Dollar General store.**

Others:

Election Results

- Latta noted that the Marijuana ban on all types of facilities had passed, as did the marijuana tax. The fire district bond also passed. He was very happy that all of our City council incumbents were voted in. A lot of City's don't have the pleasure of working with a consistent Council.

Moore St. Improvement Project

- Scholz said that if you remember, we had postponed the Moore St. project because the bids received were extremely high, and we had decided to postpone the project until a better time in which to submit bids. There is interest being expressed by contractors in relation to upcoming projects, and he thinks we shouldn't wait until the end of the year to get started. He'd like to have Branch Engineering work on updating the new bid, and get it out after that is complete.

- Latta said that in a recent bid (for another City) that there had been 8 bids turned in. We want to give them plenty of time to complete the work, so that we can help obtain that favorable bid.
- Boese asked about that; he was concerned about how long the project could take, and its effect on business owners.

Scholz said that he'd like to state that at least substantial completion should be done in the month of June. Latta said that they could start anytime after the bid is accepted. He thought that what Boese was looking for, was could we say it must be completed within a certain time frame, like two months. Scholz told him that we did put deadlines on the bid last time, because it was backed by the SCA (small City allotment) grant. You can give dates and incur certain penalties if the work isn't done by then. Latta asked if we can actually say that once started, that you have two months to complete the work? (From start to finish). Scholz recommended strongly that we don't do that. It will cause much higher prices to apply. Puls thought that contractors would probably work with us. Scholz said that you'll have to be really careful with that. If you limit them, then you are applying constraints that make it harder for them to complete the job, especially when you are looking at things like the weather. Boese was just thinking of business owners, and the street's being shut down. Caughey added that was his concern too. However, Scholz said that Hurds like's this time frame a lot better than the other time. There are certain things the contractor has to do, like maintain a traffic thru way. They can have limited times in which to shut the entire street down, but it requires a lot of communication.

Tree Committee Appointment

- Mayor Duncan appointed Parks Committee member Vesta Craiger to the Tree Committee. She wanted to be on that committee in addition to Parks.

Budget Committee and Planning Commission Openings

- Latta remarked that Eldridge had put together a notice for openings we had on the Budget Committee. We had three openings on the budget committee, and one on Planning Commission. Francisco Garcia-Mendez would not be renewing his term on the Planning Commission due to getting a new job that was taking up more time.
- Eldridge asked Council to please be asking your neighbors, family and friends if they'd like to serve the City. She will be asking the two members of the Budget Committee if they want to renew their terms; they will be at the same board meeting with her later this week.

Strategic Plan

- Latta said that by Council resolution, I am required to provide an updated Strategic Plan for Council to consider in November. However, the work with the Sesquicentennial event made it impossible to meet that deadline. He will be bringing it to Council in December. They'll see some significant changes with the focus on transportation and water.
- Caughey said he would not be here for the December meeting.

- Latta liked the article that Caughey had given the LOC (League of Oregon Cities); he was featured in the Local Focus newsletter.
- Caughey said that when he was asked, he extracted data from the report he was given, and tweaked it a little.
- Puls was glad that our little town was featured in the newsletter, and thanked him for doing that.

Zoning Code Update

- Latta reminded everyone that we have only one meeting in the months of November and December, due to the holidays. If we have any need for additional meetings, we will let Council know. We are on our way with the Planning Commission to revamping the land use code for the City. We are reviewing four chapters at the next meeting. We are using the model code form the DLCDC (Department of Land Use and Conservation) for small cities as a springboard. He's using it and adding the code elements we feel is important, if it's not in the model code. It will be a hybrid of sorts. We will have a substantial zoning code in hand when the review is complete. He anticipates it taking 7 months. It will eventually be noticed, and will go for formal review.

Railroad Issues

- Latta said that Councilors may have noticed that the railroad was working on 4th Street for maintenance. The City didn't ask for them to do that, it was their own work for that section of track that was having problems. That work will be finished soon. We also talked to our engineer about creating standards on railroads; which requires modification to the subdivision ordinance. That changes some of the street widths. He will send notice to DLCDC tomorrow. We will meet with the Planning Commission in December, and Council will see that in January. We factored in some other things while we were at it. It looks really good.

Fire/Rescue Board Bond/Relocation of Cedar Square Tenant

- Mayor Duncan asked Bob Bronson if they had any idea of when they might be breaking ground, once they get certification on the election.
- Bronson said perhaps in May. They have to talk to the finance officer with the special districts people, but we don't want to wait too long to get started. He knew there was some concern about the dentist office in Cedar Square. He felt that we should be able to come up with something in our community to help accommodate them. Private citizens included, could do something. We have enough people here that are exploring things; like they could look at the piece of property that is available from the City. He felt that getting a doctor and dentist in our community was a priority. He thought that there must be grant money available somewhere for rural communities to get those kinds of services. Look at what Monroe was able to get for their library over there.
- Latta said that he had shared that situation with Bronson previously. The City has been working with the dentist to try to come up with some workable options for relocation. The Dentist went to his finance people, who unfortunately, found that the construction costs for the building alone, let alone in the type of specialized equipment and

infrastructure they need, would cost over a million at this point. He can't do that by himself. We are approaching medical groups, to see if we can find a partner for him. We do have money set aside in the HRA (Harrisburg Redevelopment Agency), which might be utilized for support. We need to have some good community discussion about that.

- Bronson said that government has some limitations, but the entire community should be able to come up with something. Medical buildings are so much more expensive on a square foot basis, because of all the regulatory requirements. He would like to work on that.
- Boese asked what the timeframe for the dentist was to be out of the Cedar Square building.
- Latta said mid-June is when the lease runs out.
- Bronson felt that our community was large enough to provide business for a clinic. He thought that there had to be some kind of grant out there for rural areas that we could find.
- Keaton added that he wouldn't be here for the next Council meeting, due to a standing commitment.

With no further business, the City Council adjourned at the hour of 7:42pm.

Harrisburg Committee Openings

Harrisburg Planning Commission. The City of Harrisburg Planning Commission has an opening for a four-year term, starting Jan 1, 2017. The term ends on Dec 31, 2020. You must live inside the Harrisburg City limits in order to be eligible for the position.

The Planning Commission meets once a month, on the third Tuesday, starting at 7:00pm. The Planning Commission makes decisions on land use applications for the City, and will be reviewing the City's Zoning Ordinance over the next year. This is a great way to be involved in a position that's important to the City of Harrisburg.

Harrisburg Budget Committee. The City of Harrisburg has one term open for the Budget Committee, for a position starting on Jan 1, 2017, and ending on Dec 31, 2019. The Budget Committee has an important job of determining how your tax dollars are spent in the City.

The Budget Committee actually completed the budget review in its entirety within one meeting in 2016. In general though, we review the budget in two meetings, with a third optional meeting being scheduled if needed. This committee meets on Monday evenings in the month of May.

If you are interested in either position, please fill out a City Committee form, and submit it to the City for review. The Planning Commission member is appointed by the City Council, and the Budget Committee member is appointed by the Mayor.
