Street Construction News: The Smith St., 2nd St., and Macy St. Street Improvement Project is starting to wrap up, with major paving having been completed as of the end of April. Street trees are now being planted, but lots of finish work still remains. Access to the post office, and our businesses in this area is now open. Coronavirus Guidelines: As of Friday, April 30, Linn County is moving to an Extreme Risk level. Spring Has Sprung!

Spring is here and the grass is growing! City Municipal Code prohibits properties less than one acre in size from having grass or other noxious vegetation taller than 10 inches in height, or from crossing property boundaries and interfering with pedestrian or vehicular traffic. All trees must be maintained to a minimum of eight feet above walkways and 12 feet above roadways. Lets all do our part in making our town look great, our neighbors happy and to not being a fire hazard!

Water: Base Rate: \$21.30

Per Unit: \$1.74 (per *EUU)

Sewer: Minimum Charge: \$21.18

Sewer User Fee: \$7.68 (per *EUU)

Storm Drain: \$3.60

*An EUU is equal to 748 gals of metered water
