City Administrator's Message

The new year is upon us, we are all likely reflecting upon what we did in 2013, and pondering about what we'd like to accomplish this year. This month the City Council will be discussing their goals, and what they would like to see accomplished in the City this next year. Two items the Council has been passionate about in recent years is the H.A.R.T. Family Resource

Center and fiscal responsibility. These two items are again in the spotlight this year.

HART, a part of the City organization, has been serving Harrisburg families for almost 16 years. Its mission is to be a core community connector in Harrisburg that is dedicated to actively reaching and providing opportunities for all individuals, families and groups to improve their lives. HART offers services, resources and activities that help create a vital, vibrant, and active community. Services offered through HART include, a cooperative preschool, parenting workshops, volunteer trainings, youth summer camps, ESL classes, and much more. HART is a valued asset to Harrisburg, and without it many of the services it provides would not be locally accessible to our citizens.

HART was originally funded by several State and County grants. As these revenue sources have gone away, the City has increased its financial support to HART. Today, difficult budgetary decisions have to be made as to whether the City can continue to fund HART without additional revenue. The City Council has been discussing this topic at its recent meetings, and is considering placing a measure on the May 2014, ballot to ask the Harrisburg voters to pass an operations levy to financially support the HART Family Resource Center. As your City Administrator, I encourage you to get to know the issues around this decision, some of which are included in this newsletter. Also, visit the HART Family Resource Center and see if their services can help you, your neighbor or friend.

The sewer user fee per equivalent user unit (EUU) is \$6.76. <u>For example</u> : During November, 7 units of water was used. Sewer charges for that month would be \$47.32 (7 units X \$6.76). During December, 5 units of water was used.
