This past month the city completed a project which added a new section of sidewalk and storm drainage along Hwy 99 in front of Gheen Irrigation Inc. The sidewalk improvements now connect the city's downtown with the properties north on Peoria Road, including Knife River, and the Jehovah's Witness and Life Bible Churches. The sidewalk connection was about 450 feet in length. Other improvements included striping a bike lane on the highway, and improving two existing accesses for Gheen Irrigation's property.
