Please Keep Sidewalks and Streets Leaf Free

Contrary to popular belief, the City does not provide leaf removal services. The city does not have equipment capable of removing large piles of leaves and other yard debris from streets and sidewalks. We ask you to please dispose of the leaves and yard debris in your yard debris containers provided by Republic Services.



Debris swept into streets frequently clog gutters and storm drains making it a problem for everyone. Please be considerate for those that live in your neighborhood. Lets give the storm systems time to respond to downpours, and heavy rain that last all day. When the entire storm water system is engaged, it can take a while for the water to drain out of the City, especially when the river is up, and the farmlands around us are saturated too. If you have a storm drain that is backing up, and there hasn't been a torrential downpour in the last few hours, please contact us at City Hall and let us know at 541-995-6655.
