What is a City Recorder / Asst. City Administrator?


Many people in town have asked me what a City Recorder does. It differs from city to city! In Harrisburg, the Recorder is: part of the management team; responsible for HR; classifies City's ordinances, resolutions and other legal papers; records meetings; distributes meeting agendas and minutes; retains city records; responds to public disclosure requests; manages liens, building permits and SDC's; maintains the city's website; and, is the City's Risk Coordinator.

One of the fun aspects of my job is working with historical records. Did you know that we have a survey of historic homes in Harrisburg? Your home may be in the survey! Citizens are welcome to look at the survey and any other public record. The City is working to scan older minutes and ordinances of the city so they are electronically available to the public. It's neat to look back at who and what made our city what it is to-day!

As the City Recorder/Assistant City Administrator, I also am responsible for the Public Library. We have a terrific Library here in Harrisburg, ran by our devoted Librarian Cheryl Spangler. We are working hard to bring you more events, and other offerings in the Library. Call Cheryl at 541-995-6949 if you'd like to find out more information about our book club, reading times, the summer reading program, and other great programs offered by the Library. Did you know that our Library has 12,431 print items, 162 audio books, and 175 videos that can be checked out? In 2013-14, 1084 residents had library cards, 8,927 people visited the library, and 6,295 books and other materials were checked out. The Library also has new hours, including Saturdays!
