Harrisburg FY 2020-21 Budget

Harrisburg, like cities and counties around the nation, faces unique challenges in constructing a new budget that will take effect July 1, 2020.

We know overall city revenues will be down, perhaps drastically, for the remainder of this year and next. Because it is so hard to estimate just how things will go, we are planning for some reductions in city services. However, core municipal services such as police, water, sewer and streets should remain basically stable.
