Harrisburg's Eagle Park News: The City continues to work on development in Eagle Park, as promised in the Parks Master Plan process. At the end of July, Staff made a presentation the Oregon Parks and Recreation Department board, in support of the \$250,000 grant request. This request is for the addition of a play-ground and fitness center, just north of the dog park. It will also allow for the upper park area to be landscaped and terraced. As many have already seen, we are working to develop the park on a shoestring budget. We regret that BOLI wages amplify the labor costs for such a simple project. Thank goodness for grants! Keep your fingers crossed that the City is able to get this grant awarded. Also, watch the riparian forest just south of the dog park, as the picnic tables should be delivered soon.

<u>Fire Danger:</u> The City appreciates the Harrisburg Fire/Rescue District whose volunteers work so hard to protect all of Harrisburg citizens from danger. Please pay attention to high fire danger postings, and follow guidelines that help to protect all of us.

Water Bond Project Information: Finish work for the north water tank is being done while the welding for the south water tank is almost finished. The north water filtration plant is under construction, while the pads and building foundation for the south plant filtration system is being installed, along with the support work for the electrical system. The contractor is in the process of purchasing the vertical turbine pumps and the chemical feed systems. Work has been started on Well No. 9; the well that will eventually replace Well No. 5. (The well with the most sedimentation, iron and manganese, will be discontinued at the end of this process). The north system will be completed before the south system; we need that system to be in use before we can eventually switch wells. The City Council also approved the \$3.5M loan that was provided by the State of Oregon Special Public Works Fund. This loan is budgeted and planned; it will help us to complete the work on the water filtration systems. The projected rate increases for 2025-2026 have been approved, at 5% for water, sewer, and storm services, and are now in effect. For a household with 4 units of usage, there is an average increase of \$3.34 on their utility bill. That is still less than the rates that were projected when the City was advertising the 2017 bonds. Work on the new water system should be finished by early winter, 2026.

Code Enforcement Reminders

Let's talk about vehicles! Specifically, inoperable and/or discarded vehicles. "Discarded vehicle" means an inoperable vehicle on private property for a period of more than 10 days, except when:

b. The vehicle is kept within a garage or other sight-obscuring building

"Inoperable vehicle" means a vehicle, or major parts of a vehicle, that cannot be driven on a public street because of problems such as body damage, engine or transmission problems, missing parts, flat tire, or expired license plates.

These vehicles MAY NOT be stored on a public street (with very minor and incredibly limited exceptions) nor outside in plain view (see above).

These vehicles could be towed and the violator(s) fined up to \$500 PER DAY that the violation(s) occur.

If you have received a note from Code Enforcement and/or have questions, please call City Hall at 541-995-6655.
