City Administrator's Message

New Parking Regulations now in effect. Please remember that while the City is stepping up code enforcement hours, that our system is still complaint driven. If your neighbor has Il cars parked on your street, leaving no room for anyone else to park, please call and let us know. Under the new code, RV's, campers, boats, travel trailers, utility trailers, or other personal property may not be parked in a public right-of-way for more than 48 hours. It is the intent of the City Council to prohibit long-term storage of vehicles and personal property on City streets, alleys, rights-of-way, or other public property. Moving a vehicle from place to place on public ways or property does not constitute compliance with the new code. Call Caleb at 541-995-6655, if you have questions about the new code requirements, or to report a problem in your neighborhood.

Operable vehicles may be in a public right-of-way for 14 days if the vehicle is parked adjoining the property and address shown on the registration. Likewise, for not more than 48 hours if it isn't parked within 100' of the property and address shown on registration. The time decreases to 24 hours if the vehicle is inoperable. Violations can carry a maximum fine of \$1,000 and misdemeanors can carry a fine of up to \$2,500. In extreme cases, this could result in potential jail time of up to a year. Inoperable vehicles MUST be stored in an enclosed structure, or stored in a facility designed for that purpose. Vehicles you rarely drive should be kept in your garage or driveway.

Water Line Flushing: Oct 6 thru Oct 10: Why, oh why, does the City have to flush water lines? Did you know that regular flushing in a water system helps to remove built up sediment in the water pipes? Regularly flushing fire hydrants helps maintain a healthier water system! There will occasionally be reduced pressure during this process. It's a best practice to flush out your hot water heater, other water using appliances and your faucets soon after the flushing process has been completed. Its also a good idea to refrain from using large amounts of

water, washing whites or light colored clothing on all flushing days.

Harrisburg's Eagle Park News: EAGLE PARK WINTER ACCESS SOON TO CHANGE!

Thank you Knife River, for the donation of Eco-blocks! We've put them to good use in the park, by creating barricades. The park keeps getting damaged due to off-road vehicles. Once the road starts getting flooded out, vehicles will be blocked by the gate located next to the

dog park. People will still have pedestrian access to every part of the park that the river and weather haven't blocked off; and our law enforcement officials, farmers, and HFRD will all have keys and access to the gate. The dog park will remain open and available, with lots of parking available. We hate to impact our avid fishers, but this is one of the only ways to discourage vehicles ruining the

roads and trails. All trails will remain open during the winter, providing the river cooperates!

The filtration systems are being focused on, with the contractor continuing to work on the mixing systems for both the north and

south plant. We are quickly coming to the (dreaded) time period that will make it look like nothing is happening. Most of the electrical, fine mechanical and plumbing, are <u>inside</u> the tanks and the filtration buildings. Those buildings are the heart of the new system that will remove elements that make our water aesthetically poor. The new system is scheduled to be online in late 2026. The City has now spent all funding available through the HRA, and the Water Bond, and is now drawing directly from the \$3.5M loan provided by the State of Oregon Special Public Works Fund.

Code Enforcement Reminders

While winter isn't quite here yet, it's time to remember some very important information regarding leaves and vegetation. The City of Harrisburg does NOT offer a leaf pickup service and leaves are NOT to be pushed into the street. Our sweeper is aging and leaves are too much for it to handle. Please make sure to use your yard waste pickup can from Republic Services. And a quick reminder about RV's as additional dwelling units: RV's, travel trailers, campers and similar vehicles are NOT permitted to be used as additional dwelling units in the City of Harrisburg. You may be trying to help out a friend or family member, but doing so can result in potential citations and fines. Additionally, they must also be stored on the owner's property and not on a public street or right-of-way. If you have received a note from Code Enforcement and/or have questions, please call City Hall at 541-995-6655.
