The City would like to send a huge thank you to a Planning Commission member who has served the City since 2008. Roger Bristol has served for 14 years, and is now moving out of this area to where he is rebuilding their retirement home. We appreciate all the years that he has served the public, and all the land use projects that he has helped make decisions on. He was with the Planning Commission when we had the original overhaul of the zoning and subdivision codes, and now we are almost finished with the 2nd overhaul!

Would you like to serve the City of Harrisburg and make decisions on land use issues, or on the ways we can change the City Code to provide more options for property owners that would like to develop their properties? Apply by February 28 if you are interested! The term now vacant ends on December 31, 2023; the Planning Commission generally only meets on the 3rd Tuesday of each month. You can find the city committee application on the City website.

Do you like numbers? How would you like to help plan how the City spends your hard earned tax dollars? If so, you might be interested in the Budget Committee. There is a vacant position with a term ending December 31, 2023, just waiting for you to apply. The same application is used for either opening that the City has; this one has been open for a year, and doesn't have a deadline. The Budget Committee meets on Mondays, and generally only 1 or 2 times a year.
