Happy 2023! It's a New Year, full of fresh, new beginnings. A New Year always feels like it has so much potential. It's a time of year in which we can be thankful for what we have, but in which it's also traditional to set new goals. I love the promise of a New Year!

The City has a Strategic Plan in place, that we work on annually. It covers the next five years in a row. If you'd like to see what kinds of things the City is working on, or wonder what kinds of priorities the City has, please take a look at the current plan. The City Council will be considering new goals at the meetings in January and February. Citizens are always welcome to drop by and join them during a meeting, if you'd like to see what's going on.

Priorities in this current year include creating and advocating for a wide range of housing opportunities while preserving and improving existing affordable housing; developing, maintaining and improving total city park land inventory; make regular and substantive improvements to City streets; bring community awareness to crime issues in the City, creating solutions to reduce & prevent crime; enhancing outreach to existing businesses, including working with regional partnerships to promote Harrisburg businesses and economic development; and updating the Capital Improvement Program, including verification that our fees structures and SDC's are still competitive.

The HART Community Center has been active in our community since 1999. They are working with the Oregon West Council of Government (OCWCOG) to provide some more resources to the community. In January, the following is available:

Senior Health Insurance Benefits Assistance (SHIBA) program is presenting a class that will cover the basics of Medicare parts A, B, C, and D. This class is designed for anyone who will be eligible for Medicare within a few months or is new to Medicare. Current beneficiaries who would like a better understanding of their Medicare benefits and options will also find this class valuable. Spouses and other relatives are welcome to attend. A SHIBA counselor will present this class, which is sponsored by the OCWCOG and part of its AmeriCorps Seniors programs. AmeriCorps is the federal agency connecting individuals and organizations through service and volunteering to tackle the nation's most pressing challenges.
