Annexation/Zone Change Public Hearing Notice. The upper portion of Eagle Park is inside the City's Urban Growth Boundary (UGB). As such, the City is annexing this property into the City limits, and is changing the zoning to Public Use Zoning. As a Type IV process under the City's development code, the City is required to inform the neighbors and anyone affected by these changes. The Planning Commission will hold a public hearing on June 20th, and will allow testimony in relation to this request. The recommendation by the Planning Commission will be provided to the City Council on June 27th, when the 2nd public hearing is scheduled. You can testify during this meeting as well. 31.2 acres of property, consisting of 23.5 acres of upland, will be annexed. This property is also known as 15S-04W-21, and is a portion of Tax Lot 300.
